Routes of access to work of the author prior to about 1990

The original idea, to make all work prior to about 1990 also available on the website of the author, has been abandoned for many reasons.

Depending on the type of reference the material can be accessed following various standard routes.

Papers in Transactions etc

Papers in Transactions of professional Societies and in Proceedings of Symposia as well as in professional Journals can be inspected in libraries collecting the particular types of publication in question.

If this is not possible or not convenient copies of such papers can be obtained via Subito. Terms of usage etc are to be found on the website of the service: www.subito-doc.de. There will be similar document services in other countries.

Searches for Journals and Books result in lists of libraries collecting the series in question and being prepared to deliver copies. The author found copies on paper received via ordinary mail, usually within a few days, most convenient.

Gray literature: Reports etc

In Germany the library collecting 'grey literature', not properly published in the standard formats of books or papers mentioned above, e. g. reports, brochures etc, is the Technische Informationsbibliothek (TIB) at the University Hannover. Terms of usage etc are to be found on the website of the library: www.tib.uni-hannover.de.

While the collection of the Mitteilungen der Versuchsanstalt für Wasserbau und Schiffbau (VWS) is complete, the collection of the reports (VWS-Berichte) is not complete. Reports and other publications of the author and his colleagues are currently being filled in. As noted in the bibliographies on the website of the author, the FDS-Berichte mentioned, the reports of the Forschungszentrum des Deutschen Schiffbaus (FDS), are usually identical in content with VWS-Berichte.

A complete set of VWS-Berichte has been moved to the central library (UB) of the Technical University Berlin (TUB) after the libraries of VWS and of the Institut für Schiffs- und Meerestechnik (ISM) have been closed.
