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Dear Professor Tamura,

many thanks for your quick response. I remember that I once attended a meeting at Shimomoseki arriving from Pusan via the battle field of Tshu-shima.

As I indicated the re-analysis of the ISO/DIS example would be of great interest. Concerning the suspected 'misprint' I shall wait for an answer from Prof. Ikehata.

Certainly I did not suspect a misprint in your data. But I noted that according to my analysis your data are inconsistent due to the traditional method of synthesis. That you could analyse them with your method is evident as discussed in my paper to be presented.

I fully agree with you, that measured data contain much random noise. But the interesting observation is that the one error under discussion does not look random. It is an outlier for whatever reason. My suspicion is that it is a misprint.
